MONOCHROME BLEU: What is a Linz? I'd heard a couple pieces from this band on various compilations, but they didn't prepare me for this. Sounding at times like a noisy fusion band, at others like unrepentant experimentalists and at others like closet popsters. Monochrome Bleu is eclectic by nature, not affectation. With care and insight they explore some of the dark comers of the human psyche, yet this is not a vision of unrelieved bleakness. The sax player is as much at home with free playing as with drones, and for once here's a band that knows what to do with electronic percus-



## Monochrome Bleu - Live Concerts



MONOCHROME BLEU: Taucher This Austrian group incorporates slightly muted guitars, loud saxophones, electronic drums, and mostly spoken or chanted vocals in a jazzy brew that is somehow oddly infectious in its dissonance and occasional zaniness. Wisely toning down the more anarchic implications of their jazz inspirations, Monochrome Bleu nevertheless manages a little too often to goof around to the point of obnoxiousness. The band is at its best when the guitars achieve a steady melodic groove ("Mama Tengo," "African Drums") and the saxophones are used for sinewy, rather than shrieking, effect. There is also a modern sensibility present that prevents Taucher from sounding dated, mainly evident in the dirge-like qualities of "This Is Not/ Ballerinas of Manaus" and the quirky pop aesthetic of "Song." With a clearer focus on song structure and a beefing up of the guitars and the rather lame rhythm section. Monochrome Bleu could achieve a jazzfunk-rock fusion as successfully satisfying as Rip Rig and Panic. (Die Ind, Box 239, 4041 Linz, Austria) - Nils Bernstein

'In their monochrome musical lunguage they reduce, open imaginary rooms for their audience and procure them a journey through their heads. Monochrome Bleu create a kind of music, which gets its dynamics from the the Austrian cultural and georaphical situation on the crossroad between the german and slavic influences. On one side tough 'machinelike' teutonic beats and on the other side melancholy, sensebility, very near to lamentation. With their experimental tendency Monochrome Bleu disfigure traditions, create a strange Kind of jazz-rock & industrial music and still operate against 'new consevative tendencies'.


